शैक्षणिक वर्ष 2023-24 में हिन्दी विभाग वर्ष भर सक्रिय रहा। विभाग द्वारा दो राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठियों का आयोजन किया वहीं दूसरी ओर तीन शैक्षणिक भ्रमण भी हुए। विद्यार्थियों के लिए अभिनंदन समारोह और विदाई समारोह आयोजित किए गए साथ ही हिन्दी विभाग से सेवानिवृत्त तीन शिक्षक साथियों का भी सम्मान किया गया। 19-20 मार्च को अनहद साहित्योत्सव का आयोजन उल्लेखनीय है जो अपनी तरह का, महाविद्यालय में पहला प्रयास था, जिसे इफ़को सहकारिता की ओर से आर्थिक सहायता प्राप्त हुई एवं फ़िल्म और ड्रामैटिक समिति के सहसंयोजन में किया गया।

पहली राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठी 6 अप्रैल 2023 को आयोजित की गई जिसका विषय था-स्वाधीनता आंदोलन और हिंदी। इस कार्यक्रम की अध्यक्षता प्रोफ़ेसर पूरन चंद टंडन ने की। वक्ता के रूप में हिन्दी विभागाध्यक्ष, सीनियर प्रोफ़ेसर कुमुद शर्मा, विशिष्ट वक्ता के रूप में हरिसिंह गौर विश्वविद्यालय के हिन्दी विभाग के अध्यक्ष प्रोफ़ेसर आनंद प्रकाश त्रिपाठी और मुंबई विद्यापीठ के हिंदी विभाग के अध्यक्ष प्रोफ़ेसर करुणा शंकर उपाध्याय रहे। इन सभी वक्ताओं ने स्वाधीनता आंदोलन में भी हिंदी की विभिन्न विधाओं की भूमिका पर विचार विमर्श किया और और देश की आज़ादी में हिंदी के महत्व को बताया गया।

हिन्दी विभाग द्वारा आयोजित दूसरी संगोष्ठी 7 और 8 नवंबर 2023 को संपन्न हुई जिसका विषय था- हरिशंकर परसाई और प्रेमचंद का समय और समाज। 7 नवंबर की संगोष्ठी में हरिशंकर परसाई के व्यंग्य साहित्य की तीक्ष्णता और प्रासंगिकता पर चर्चा हुई। इस सत्र की अध्यक्षता प्रोफ़ेसर प्रेम सिंह ने की थी और वक्ता के रूप में डॉक्टर राजेश कुमार एवं प्रोफ़ेसर संजीव कुमार ने अपने ज्ञान वर्धन व्याख्यान से श्रोताओं को लाभान्वित किया। 8 नवंबर को प्रेमचंद के कथा साहित्य में समाज पर चर्चा की गई। इस दिन के कार्यक्रम की अध्यक्षता सीनियर प्रोफ़ेसर पूरन चंद टंडन जी ने की और वक्ता के रूप में डॉक्टर संजय कुमार सेठ एवं इन्दिरा गांधी राष्ट्रीय मुक्त विश्वविद्यालय के प्रति कुलपति प्रोफ़ेसर सत्यकाम जी थे। इन दोनों दिनों के सत्रों ने हरिशंकर परसाई और प्रेमचंद के साहित्य में समाज का उद्घाटन और उनके साहित्य की वर्तमान समय में भी उपयोगिता और प्रासंगिकता पर प्रकाश डाला गया।

14 सितंबर 2023 को हिंदी दिवस के उपलक्ष्य में एक कार्यक्रम रखा गया जिसका शीर्षक था - देशज भाषा और भाषा की राजनीति। इस कार्यक्रम में वक्ता थे- प्रोफ़ेसर मनिन्द्र ठाकुर और प्रोफ़ेसर राम प्रकाश द्विवेदी। इस संगोष्ठी में हिन्दी भाषा के महत्व और उससे संबंधित विभिन्न स्तरों पर चलने वाले राजनीति की भी चर्चा की गई।

विद्यार्थियों के लिए प्रमुख आकर्षण का केंद्र उनका विदाई समारोह एवं नव आगंतुक समारोह होता है। 10 अप्रैल 2023 को तृतीय वर्ष के छात्रों को विदाई दी गई एवं 13: सितंबर 2023 को प्रथम वर्ष के छात्रों के लिए ओरिएंटेशन कार्यक्रम एवं पोस्टर-निर्माण सम्बंधी एक व्याख्यान कराया गया जिसमें वक्ता थे श्री गौरव तिवारी। गौरव ने अपने उपयोगी व्याख्यान से छात्रों को पोस्टर बनाने की विभिन्न तकनीकों से अवगत कराया।

शैक्षणिक भ्रमण से विद्यार्थी देश की सांस्कृतिक और साहित्यिक विरासत से रूबरू होते हैं और शिक्षक एवं विद्यार्थियों के संबंध भी सुदृढ़ होते हैं। इसी प्रयोजन के तहत हिन्दी विभाग ने इस वर्ष तीन शैक्षणिक भ्रमणों का आयोजन किया। सर्वप्रथम विभाग विद्यार्थियों को 25 अप्रैल 2023 को संसद भवन की यात्रा पर ले गया ताकि बच्चे देश की सामाजिक-राजनैतिक व्यवस्था से अवगत हो सकें। 9, 10 और 11 अक्टूबर 2023 को विभाग छात्रों के साथ ऋषिकेश, उत्तराखंड की यात्रा पर गया। इस यात्रा में बच्चों ने देश की सांस्कृतिक धरोहर और विरासत के दर्शन किए साथ ही उनका साहित्यिक विकास भी हुआ। 29 फरवरी 2024 को अमृत उद्यान की यात्रा की गई और वहाँ के सुन्दर फूलों और प्राकृतिक सौंदर्य के साथ साथ देश की सर्वोच्च शक्ति के केन्द्र राष्ट्रपति-भवन की मनमोहक सुंदरता का भी आनंद लिया गया।

19 और 20 मार्च 2024 को, अनहद, साहित्य-उत्सव का आयोजन किया गया जिसमें देश विदेश के जानेमाने अभिनेता, कथाकार, उपन्यासकार, लोक गायक शामिल हुए। 19 मार्च को दो सत्र थे पहले सत्र का विषय था-लेखक से बातचीत जिसमें प्रोफ़ेसर कुमुद शर्मा और डॉक्टर उमाशंकर चौधरी से, डॉक्टर मुन्ना कुमार पांडे और डॉक्टर प्रवीण कुमार ने विभिन्न साहित्यिक विषयों पर और चुनौतियों पर बहुत ही सार गर्भित बातचीत की। इस तरह का यह सत्र सत्यवती महाविद्यालय का अब तक का पहला सत्र था जो अपने आप में अनुपम अनूठा और निराला था।

UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)

Satyawati College

Coordinator: Dr. Neelu Anita Tigga

Satyawati College, University of Delhi launched its action plan with respect to Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) through an awareness generation programme on April 23rd, 2022. Team UBA was constituted by Principal, Prof. Nirmal Jindal under the convenorship of Dr. Neelu Anita Tigga, Associate Professor, Department of Political Science. Satyawati College has adopted five villages for their development in collaboration with district administration. These five villages are Nahri, Khubru, Pipli Khera, Rajlu and Rasoi.

Regular meetings were conducted regarding finalizing the modalities of conducting workshops. The students were introduced to the vision and mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. Suggestions were invited from members regarding generation and circulation of google form. The details of students belonging to nearby or same rural clusters as the adopted villages were inquired to make the survey uncomplicated. Thereafter, deliberations on methods of conducting survey as per UBA literature guidelines were undertaken. Discussants were briefed about the necessary timeline, expediency and the possible plan of action in the coming months. Students were thereafter interviewed and entrusted with the task of attending the workshop and contributing in future survey endeavors.

Survey Methodology

The survey was conducted in two phases, as per the format prescribed under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. First, Household Survey (door to door, seeking response as per survey form) and second, Village Survey (one form per village to be filled by Village head). Team UBA visited Pipli Khera on November 29, 2022 with 25 student volunteers, 06 professors and 01 non-teaching staff. Rajlu Ghadi village was visited on December 6, 2022 with 18 students and 5 professors. Subsequently, Team UBA visited village Khubru on February 16, 2023; village Nahri on March 15 and village Rasoi on March 22, 2023.

A sample size collection of 100 household survey forms was successfully conducted by students and the Village Survey form was filled by the Sarpanch, as the respondent.

Major Survey Findings

- Residents have little or almost no knowledge about available and accessible government schemes such as Jan Dhan Yojna, Sukanya Samriddhi Yojna, Mudra Yojna, PM Awas Yojna amongst others. Few households have received money from Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.
- Despite wide scale unemployment there has been almost negligible affiliation to MNREGA.
- Women have insignificant empowerment opportunities with no vocational training facilities.

Opportunities

- The survey has provided first hand experience to the students about the ground realities of developmental challenges.
- Sample based survey has given students a chance to understand the gap between policies and their implementations.
- It has helped students to realize the problems faced in the villages.
- Despite being just 51 to 53 kilometers from Delhi there is little or almost no knowledge about available and accessible government schemes in the villages surveyed.

- The study has inculcated among students a sense of social responsibility in bridging the urban rural divide.

- We would like to generate more awareness regarding accessible government schemes, plastic disposition, recycling and up-cycling methods and women empowerment.
- Empowerment opportunities for women could be explored.
- Various vocational training facilities could be explored for both youth and women.

Report of Development Committee 2023-24

Convenor : Dr. Raghunath Prasad Saket

The Development Committee held several meetings with Teacher-in-charges/representatives of Departments to discuss and resolve various issues concerning workload, the appointment of guest teachers against the workload, and the requirement of additional teaching and non-teaching posts due to EWS expansion and increased students' intake. Some of the decisions are as follows;

1. The Development Committee in its meeting held on 11.06.2023, 14.08.2023, 20.10.2023 and 26.10. 2023 asked workload from all departments, finalised the format for calculation of workload, formed sub-committee to look into workload submitted by various departments for appointment of guest teachers, and after due deliberation on workload

submitted by the departments, submitted its recommendation to the Principal for appointment of guest teachers in various departments for odd semester (Semester I, III and V), against the workload.

2. The Development Committee in its meeting held on 19.01.2024 has revised the earlier calculation on requirement of teaching (40 from 16) and non-teaching (20 from 8) posts against the EWS expansion. After deliberation committee finalized additional demand of 40 teaching and 20 non-teaching posts to meet the additional workload in various departments, due to EWS expansion and increased students' intake. The decision was submitted to the Principal with request to submit the same to the higher authorities (University of Delhi and UGC) for rectification and revision on requirement of teaching and non- teaching posts.
3. The Development Committee through its meeting held on 19.01.2024 and 12.02.2024 asked the workload from all departments in prescribed format, discussed the workload submitted by the departments, and after due deliberation on workload; submitted its recommendations to the Principal for appointment of guest teachers in various departments for even semester (Semester II, IV and VI), against the workload.

REPORT OF ADMISSION COMMITTEE FOR 2023-24

Convenor : Dr. Raghunath Prasad Saket

1. The admission process for 2023-24 was completed in 7 rounds (three normal rounds of admission, two spot rounds, and two special spot rounds) through CSAS seat allocation done by the University (detail of admission in each round is attached).
2. After completion of all admission rounds, total 1152 students were admitted in various departments/ courses, as against 1309 sanction seats. Thus, 157 admissions were less than the sanctioned seat/ strength.
3. Department-wise, except for English (H), Political Science (H), and B. Com (H), there were less admission in the remaining departments than their sanctioned strength/ seats.
4. Likewise, in BA (P) out of 15 combinations, there was less admission in 9 combinations than the sanctioned seats/ strength.

5. In Honours courses Sanskrit and Urdu departments were most affected, as only 27 and 26 students could take admission in Sanskrit and Urdu Department respectively, as against 58 sanctioned seats for both the Departments.
6. Category-wise 27%, 15%, 7.5% and 10% seats were reserved for OBC, SC, ST and EWS candidates respectively; and 24% (OBC), 15% (SC), 3% (ST) and 8% (EWS) students took admission through CSAS seat allocation in the respective categories. Thus, except for SC category, seats remained vacant in all reserve categories, but relatively ST category was the most affected.
7. For supernumerary admission 5% seats were reserved for PwBD, CW, Sports and ECA each. Only 1.2% students, 1.5% students and 2.5% students took admission under PwBD, CW and sports + ECA respectively. Thus, seats remained vacant in all supernumerary categories, but relatively PwBD category was the most affected.

Suggestions

1. In Honours courses—Sanskrit and Urdu Departments— were the most affected departments, as actual admission under CSAS seat allocation was less than half of sanctioned strength of these two Departments. In addition, admission of reserve categories (SC, ST, OBC and EWS) was also NIL in these two departments. Thus, the University should devise different method of admission (other than the general admission for all departments/ courses) to ensure that all seats are full in these departments. One could be allowing college to invite application forms following the university guidelines and do admission of its own in these departments.
2. The university allocated students to college under supernumerary quota in the last round of admission and therefore, because of the delay in seat allocation most of the prospective students took admission in other Universities and institutions. Thus, the University should allocate students to colleges under supernumerary quota (PwBD, CW, PMSSS, Sports and ECA) at the beginning of admission, so that prospective students can take admission in their respective supernumerary categories in time.
3. Due to delay in seat allocation under supernumerary quota, most of the PwBD candidates who are allocated seats under UR or other categories hesitate to take admission under these categories for fear of losing PwBD

benefits (such as fee concession, scholarship, and other benefits). Thus, the University should make guidelines clarifying that reserve category students will not lose any benefits of their category (such as fee concession and scholarship, etc.) if they are offered admission in UR or other higher categories based on their merit.

4. This report was discussed in the admission committee meeting and was duly approved.

- Team Viksit Bharat of Satyawati College has generated a google form incorporating details of existing and future developments in multifarious fields such as economy, science and technology, infrastructure, innovation and sustainability. The form intends to not just orient students about beneficial government schemes for students and garner awareness but also invites suggestions regarding the same. The google form has more than hundred respondents and details of the same has been attached.
- The College has also created designated pages on Viksit Bharat, Satyawati College on different social media platforms to further all details of action programmes that will be undertaken.

The planned action programme of the college under the aegis of Viksit Bharat are enumerated as below :
